Compliance Status

Partially compliant. This website is partially compliant with the requirements set out in Annex A of the UNI CEI EN 301549 standard due to the non-compliances listed below.

Following the accessibility audit, the following criteria have been identified as not fully satisfied and are included in this accessibility statement:

C.9.1.1.1 Provide text alternatives for all non-text content.

C.9.1.3.1 Information, structure, and relationships must be programmatically determinable.

C.9.1.4.3 The minimum contrast ratio between text and background must be 4.5:1 (or 3:1 for large text).

C.9.2.1.1 All functionalities must be operable via keyboard.

C.9.2.1.2 Keyboard focus must not be trapped within any component.

C.9.2.1.3 All functionalities must be operable via keyboard without requiring specific timing for individual keystrokes.

C.9.2.4.1 A mechanism must be available to skip blocks of content that are repeated across multiple web pages.

C.9.2.4.3 The focus navigation order must be meaningful and consistent.

C.9.2.4.4 The purpose of each link must be determinable from the link text or its context.

C.9.2.4.6 Headings and labels must describe the topic or purpose of their content.

C.9.2.4.7 A visible focus indicator must be present and clearly visible.

C.9.2.4.9 The purpose of each link must be identifiable from the link text alone.

C.9.3.1.2 The language of any passage or phrase in a language other than the default language must be programmatically determinable.

C.9.3.3.1 If an input error is detected, the erroneous element must be identified and the error described in text.

C.9.3.3.2 Labels or instructions must be provided when content requires user input.

C.9.3.3.1 If an input error is detected, the item in error must be identified and the error described in text.

C.9.3.3.2 Labels or instructions must be provided when content requires user input.
